XII. NCAA INITIAL ELIGIBILITY CLEARINGHOUSE CERTIFICATION

If you are planning to enroll in college as a freshman and you wish to participate in Division 1 or Division 2 athletics, you must be certified by the NCAA Initial Eligibility Clearinghouse.

The certification process should start after your junior year grades are posted on your transcript. Check with your guidance counselor to be sure that you are taking a core curriculum that meets NCAA requirements.

In addition, register to take the ACT or SAT as a junior.

Submit your Student Release Form to the Clearinghouse early in your senior year, or when you definitely have decided to participate in athletics during your freshman year in college.

In order to be certified by the Clearinghouse for the 2001-02 academic year as required by Bylaw 14.3, the student-athlete must:

A. Graduate from high school

B. Earn a grade-point average of at least 2.00 (based on a maximum 4.00 scale) in a core* curriculum of at least 13 academic courses that were successfully completed during grades 9 though 12. Only courses that satisfy the NCAA definition of a core course can be used to calculate your NCAA grade-point average. "Eighth-grade courses may not be used to satisfy core-curriculum requirements for those student-athletes entering a Division I or II collegiate institution on or after August 1, 1996." No special values are allowed for "+" or "-" grades. Core courses must include a minimum of:

C. Earn a composite score of at least 17 on the ACT or a combined score of at least 820 on the recentered SAT (or 700 on the non-recentered SAT) on a national test date.

<u>For Division I</u>: The minimum grade-point average in the 13 core courses and required ACT or SAT score vary according to the Initial-Eligibility Index, which is scheduled to take effect for students enrolling as college freshman during 2001-2002 who wish to participate in Division I athletics:
