

<u>Physicals</u>: All students in Pre-K, K, first, third, fifth, seventh, and ninth grades, sports, and new students to the Forestville Central School District, are required by law to have a physical examination within 30 days of starting school. Our school physician, will be in during the school year to perform the examinations, if we don't receive a physical from your medical provider. If you prefer your child's own doctor to perform the physical, *please make an appointment and return the bottom portion to the school.* The approved NYSED student health examination form is included in this packet. This is the ONLY form that is accepted for physicals. This form should be taken to your child's health care provider for completion. Please return it to the health care office following the physical exam.

<u>Medication</u>: If your child needs medication during the school day, please contact the school nurse. All medication will be administered by the nurse. Students are not allowed to bring and administer their own medication. The school nurse will need the following:

- 1. Doctor's order with instructions. The Parent and Physician's Authorization For Administration Of Medication is Included in this packet. This form should be taken to your child's health care provider for completion and returned to the health office.
- 2. Medication should be brought in by an adult in an original labeled container. Do not send medication to school with your child.

Both Schools: No prescription medications can be given without following the above listed procedures. Some over the counter medications can be given providing we have written authorization from the parent and the signature of either the child's physician or the school physician on the <u>Health Office Medications Parental Permission Form, which is included in this packet.</u> This includes: Tylenol, topical creams, eye drops, tums, Benadryl, throat sprays. If you want your child to have cough drops, please send in a note with a couple of cough drops for the day. Over the counter medications must be supplied by parent in original container.

In either school: Any medications found by school staff will be given to the nurse. Children cannot carry or give themselves or each other medication in school unless their prescriber has indicated the student is able to self direct, self carry and self administer the medication.

<u>Dental:</u> A law was recently enacted that expands health screenings to include optional dental exams of all students in New York State. <u>A sample Dental Health Certificate</u>, that you may take to your child's dentist, <u>is included in this packet</u>. After completion, it should be returned to the health office to be filed in your child's cumulative health record.

Please call the school's health office if you have any questions or concerns.
