

## FORESTVILLE CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

All children between the ages of five and twenty-one, who have not yet graduated from high school and who are residents of the Forestville Central School District, have a right to attend the schools within the District. Children may begin Kindergarten in September provided that they will turn five on or before December 1<sup>st</sup>. The District requests the documents listed below when determining whether your child is eligible to attend school within the Forestville Central School District.

To register your child in Forestville Central School, please visit the elementary or middle/high school during regular school hours 8 am – 3 pm. You may pick up our student registration packet at the offices or download them off of our website. Please bring the following documents with you: Proof of residency, birth certificate, immunizations records, custody papers, and report card.

## **Documentation to establish residency**

Primary consideration will be given to the following documentation:

- Signed residential lease agreement for property within the District
- Home mortgage document or other proof of ownership of residential property within the district
- Sworn and notarized statement from a landlord or property owner

If you are unable to obtain the documentation listed above, the District will consider the following documents:

- Utility bill (gas, electric, telephone, cable/satellite television)
- Membership document for organization requiring residency
- Evidence of custody (e.g. court order, guardianship papers, etc.)
- Government issued document
- Furniture rental statement

## Documentation to establish age

- Certified birth certificate
- Certified baptism records

If neither a certified birth certificate nor baptism record is available, the District will consider the following as evidence of a child's age:

- Passport
- Official driver's license
- State or other government issued ID
- School photo ID with date of birth
- Consulate ID
- Hospital or Health records
- Records from non-profit international aid agencies and voluntary agencies
- Military dependent ID card
- Native American tribal document

The District reserves the right to require verification of any documentation provided. Enrollment will not be delayed during the verification process.
