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# FORESTVILLE CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT 2012-2013 BUDGET EDITION

Due to the current economic conditions in New York, the Forestville Central School District, along with other rural districts in the state continue to face difficult financial challenges. Public education makes up a significant portion of state spending, and we realize that we need to do our part to control costs for our taxpayers.

Last year, the Forestville Board of Education and administration made some difficult programming choices. Budget reductions for the 2011-2012 school year included the elimination of three elementary teachers, one high school special education teacher, and one cleaner position. In addition, our school resource officer and curriculum developer from BOCES was reduced from two days to one day a week. Winter cheerleading and modified football were also cut. Supplies and materials were reduced for teachers and all

departments continue to look for creative ways to find efficiencies. The goal of the Board of Education for the 2012-2013 school year is to again present a budget that provides our students with quality programming, while at the same time, being fiscally responsible to the taxpayers of the Forestville Central School District. Although we received additional revenue this year, it was still not enough to offset mandated expenses that are beyond our control.

The 2012-2013 Forestville Central School District budget is estimated to be \$11,519,320, an increase of \$479,893 over the 2011-2012 school year budget. The percent increase represents a budget to-budget increase of 4.35%. As you will see by looking at the Budget Summary on pages 4 and 5, we have an increased expenditure in the debt service section of our budget. This is attributable to an increased bond anticipation note payment.

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Central School District.

We have appropriated revenue from the receipt of 2011-2012 building aid to offset the increased cost. A calculated tax levy of \$3,486,455 is required to finance this budget. This represents an increase of \$100,863 or 2.98% over the 2011-2012 levy. This falls well within the Office of State Comptroller (OSC) requirements of the cap.

Under New York State Law, the Board of Education of the Forestville Central School District is required to submit a tentative budget for public inspection fourteen days prior to the budget vote. A public budget hearing will be held on Thursday, May 3 at 6:00 p.m. in the Forestville Central School Elementary Technology Academy to provide the opportunity for you to express your comments to the Board of Education. All eligible voters will have an opportunity to vote on the budget on Tuesday, May 15, 2012 from 1:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. in the rear foyer at the high school. Parking will be available in the back parking lot. In addition to this newsletter presentation, a copy of the budget is available for public inspection in the elementary and middle/high school offices as well as in the business office located at 12 Water Street, Forestville, New York 14062. 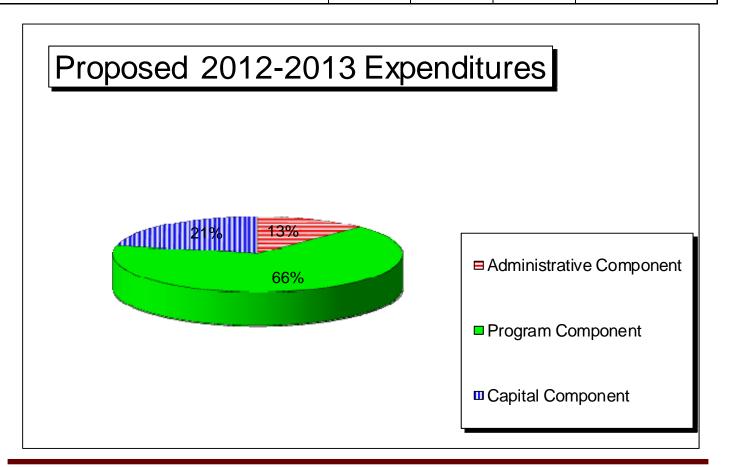

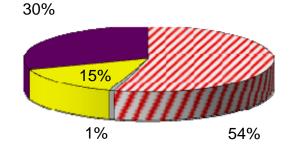

### **BOARD OF EDUCATION MEMBER VACANCIES**

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that a voting machine will be used to record the vote on the budget, on all propositions, and on the election of two at-large members of the Board of Education. The following at-large vacancies are to be filled on the Board of Education by reason of the expiration of the term of office of the two incumbents. ### ABSENTEE BALLOT PROCEDURES

Absentee ballots for the Budget Vote/Board Member Election will be available by application to the District Clerk's Office for any qualified voter who will be unable to vote in person due to illness or physical disability, hospitalization, incarceration (unless incarcerated for conviction of a felony), or travel outside the District for employment or business reasons, studies or vacation on the day of the vote/election. Applications for absentee ballots will be available from the District Clerk's Office on or after April 19, 2012. Applications must be received by the District Clerk by May 08,2012 to be processed by mail or by 4:00 p.m. on May 14, 2012 in person. Absentee ballots must be received by the District Office, by mail or in person, prior to 5 p.m. on Tuesday, May 15, 2012 to be counted.

### SALARY DISCLOSURE REGULATION

Section 111 and 112 of Chapter 274 of the Laws of 1996 amends Section 1608 and 1716 of Education Law requiring a list of the compensation for certain staff. This disclosure regulation includes the Superintendent of Schools whose annual salary is \$124,513.00 with an annualized cost of benefits and other renumeration equaling \$24,467.00 (includes mandatory contributions for Federal Social Security and New York State Teachers' Retirement System with health benefits).

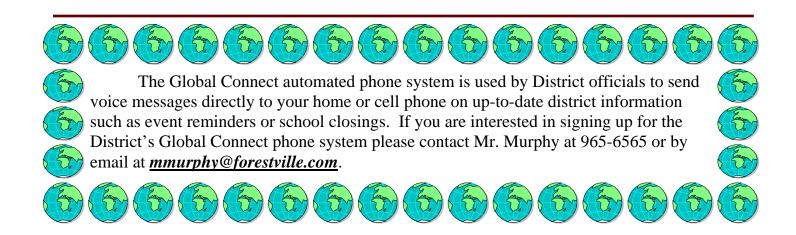
