# **Budget Issue**



### Forestville Tax Levy to Decrease in 2009-2010

As we began planning for the 2009-2010 school budget, we kept in mind the needs of our students as well as the responsibility that we have to our community taxpayers. Planning a school budget in these most difficult economic times is, to say the least, very challenging. The school board and district administration recognize this challenge and have been working diligently to develop creative ways to meet both the needs of students and community taxpayers.

With school funding being limited in the future, it is even more important to develop long-term plans that assure efficient budget planning now and in the future. The District's Finance Committee has been meeting with our financial advisor, Jeff Smith, from Municipal Solutions for the purpose of developing a five-year financial plan. This allows us to review our short and llong-term finances including revenue and expenditure budgets, and plan accordingly.

One of the findings in our initial long-range planning is that increasing the amount of debt payments to our current building and bus

purchases will allow the district to realize a potential savings of approximately one million dollars in interest over the course of the borrowing schedules.

This year's plan allows the Forestville Board of Education to present a budget that reflects a minimal decrease in the tax levy over last year's levy. The 2009-2010 school district budget is estimated to be \$11,073,122 which is an increase of \$746,531 over the 2008-2009 school year budget. The percent increase

in the budget will be recorded as 7.23%. The budget-to-budget increase without the debt payment is 3.01%. The increase over the 3.01% is due to the debt payment explained above that is offset by matching revenue and will not have an impact on the tax levy.

77 8 ш Z 2 0 I Ξ A calculated tax levy of \$3,197,818 is required to finance this budget. This represents a decrease of \$11,096 from the 2008-2009 tax levy. The percent decrease in the tax levy is - .35% or approximately six cents less per thousand of assessed value over last year's rate.

Under New York State Law, the Board of Education of the Forestville Central School District is required to submit a tentative budget for public inspection fourteen days prior to the budget vote. A public budget hearing will be held on Thursday, May 7 at 6:00 p.m. in the Forestville Central School Elementary Technology Academy to provide the opportunity for you to express your comments to the Board of Education.

All eligible voters will have an opportunity to vote on the budget on Tuesday, May 19, 2009 from 1:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Due to the construction at the high school, this year's budget vote will take place at the elementary school. Signs will be posted at the elementary school to inform the public on which door to enter and where to park.

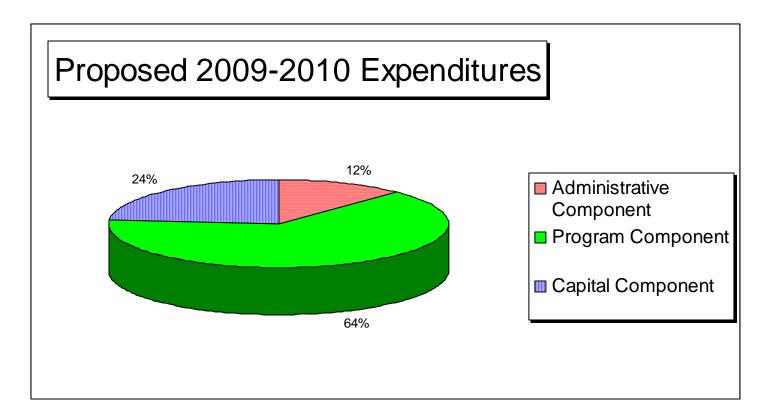

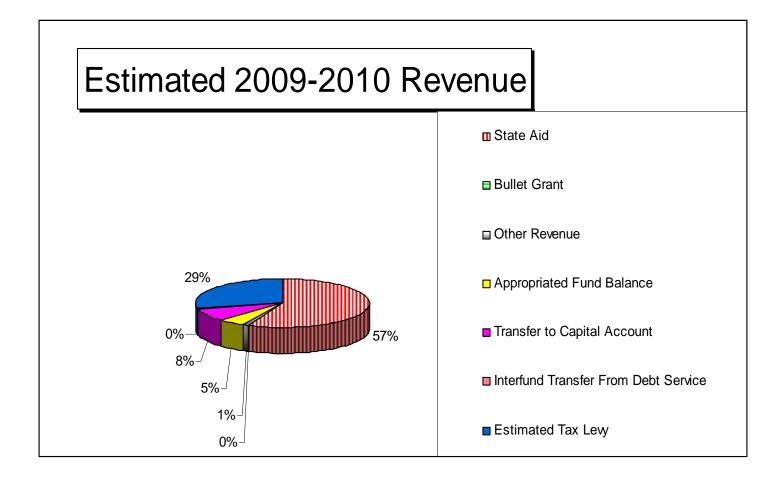

#### ABSENTEE BALLOT PROCEDURES

Absentee ballots for the Budget Vote/Board Member Election will be available by application to the District Office for any qualified voter who will be unable to vote in person due to illness or physical disability, hospitalization, incarceration (unless incarcerated for conviction of a felony), or travel outside the District for employment or business reasons, studies or vacation on the day of the vote/election. Applications for absentee ballots will be available from the District Office on or after April 20, 2009. Applications must be received by the District by May 12, 2009 to be processed by mail or by 4:00 p.m. on May 18, 2009 in person. Absentee ballots must be received by the District Office, by mail or in person, prior to 5 p.m. on Tuesday, May 19, 2009 to be counted.

#### SALARY DISCLOSURE REGULATION

Section 111 and 112 of Chapter 274 of the Laws of 1996 amends Section 1608 and 1716 of Education Law requiring a list of the compensation for certain staff. This disclosure regulation includes the Superintendent of Schools whose annual salary is \$116,912.00 with an annualized cost of benefits and other renumeration equaling \$16,006.00 (includes mandatory contributions for Federal Social Security and New York State Teachers' Retirement System with health benefits).
