Mr. Worosz's Summer Reading Challenge 2023: "Imagine Your Story"

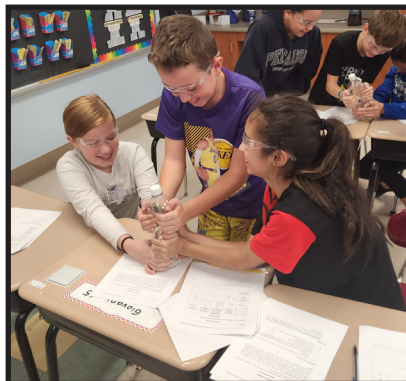
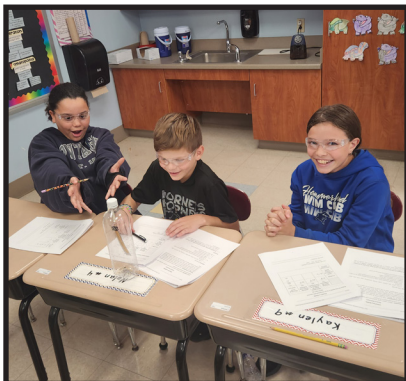
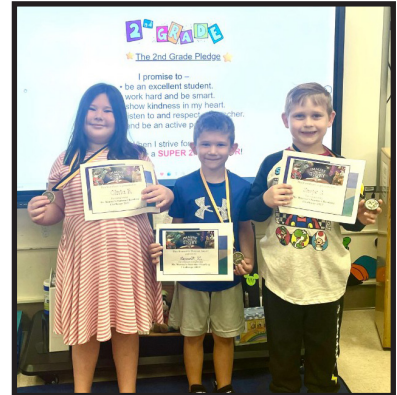

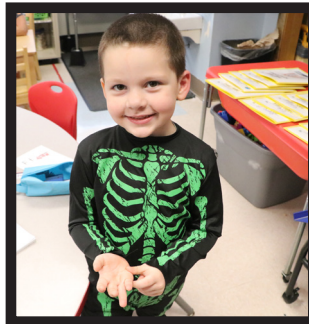
Cloud in Bottle

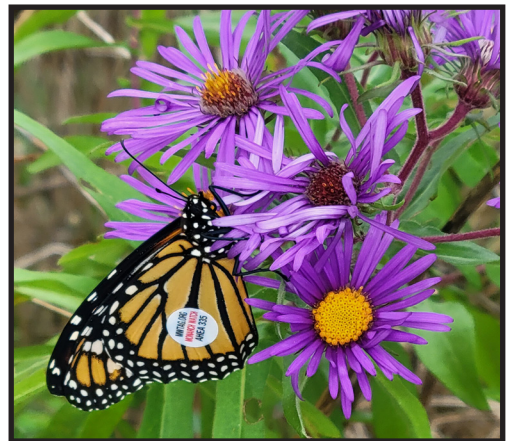
