It's hard to imagine that another school year has come and gone! As the old saying goes, "Times flies when you're having fun!" That can be the only explanation for this year flying by so fast. It was a "fun" year and an excellent year for academic progress!

If you thought this year was fun and exciting, wait until next year! We are planning a few major adjustments to our program that we feel will enhance the academic atmosphere and bring more students to the elementary building.

Our Pre-K program is expanding to two half day sessions. For the last four years, we have offered a morning only program to our four year olds. Now more students will be serviced with a smaller student to teacher ratio. If you have not signed up for the Pre-K program, it's not too late. Please contact the main office as soon as possible.

Another change to our program is the addition of a full time occupational therapist. This shift from a part-time position to a full-time one will allow us to continue to service the specialized needs of students with fine motor skill delays and also allow for a broader spectrum of preventative programming that will begin with our 4 year-olds and continue through the primary level grades.

The last major change to the elementary building for the upcoming year will be the addition of the 6th grade. We are thrilled to bring the 6th grade back to the elementary building after a 20 year absence! Our 6th graders can look forward to departmentalized programming, increased remedial services, and a host of other benefits that are afforded to all students in our building!

- Grades 3-4 goal: 5 chapter books of at least 100 pages in length.

There will be seven Thursdays throughout July and August for your child to come to school to have his/her Reading Passport updated and to receive a prize. For every 2 Book Reports completed and turned in by students in Pre-K, Kdg - Grade 2, they will receive a prize. Students in Grades 3-5 should have one of the 5 Book Report Journals completed each time they come to school to receive their prize. All Journals must be turned in during the first 4 days of the new school year beginning on Tuesday, Sept. 6, 2011 and no later than Friday, Sept. $9^{\text {th. }}$. ## USDA Summer Food Service Program Continues

The Forestville Central School District is eligible to participate in the USDA Summer Food Service Program and will be serving free lunches Monday through Friday from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. beginning July 5, 2011 and ending August 12, 2011. All resident and non-resident children 18 -years-old and younger are eligible to receive a free lunch.

Lunches will be served in the Forestville Elementary School cafeteria, 12 Water Street, Forestville, NY. Please use the front entrance of the school. The program regulations state that lunches must be eaten in the cafeteria and no food is allowed to be removed from the cafeteria. Unless a child is registered for the Forestville Village Youth Recreation Program, all children must leave school grounds when they are finished eating their lunch. Adults are not eligible to receive or buy lunch but they are welcome to accompany their child to lunch.

The District receives reimbursement for program expenses through the New York State Education Department Child Nutrition Program Administration.
