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Department of Environmental Conservation SEQR Regulations (6 NYCRR Part 617), State Environmental Quality Review Act, (SEQRA).

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WHEREAS, the SEQR Regulation (6 NYCRR Part 617) declares TYPE II Actions to be actions that have no significant impact on the environment and require no further review under SEQR; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education, as lead agency, has reviewed the Proposed Action with respect to the Type II criteria set forth in 6 NYCRR Part 617.5(c), and has, in reliance on information provided by Trane U.S. Inc., concluded that the scope of work involves the maintenance and repair of existing facilities involving no substantial changes in an existing structure or facility, and/or the replacement, rehabilitation and reconstruction of structures or facilities in kind, on the same site, without exceeding any of the thresholds in section 617.4, and/or routine activities of educational institutions, including expansion of existing facilities by less than 10,000 square feet of gross floor area;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Forestville Central School District as follows:

- 1. The Proposed Action does not exceed thresholds established under 6 NYCRR Part 617, State Environmental Quality Review Act, (SEQRA).
- 2. The Board hereby determines the Proposed Action is Type II actions in accordance with the SEQRA regulations.
- 3. No further review of the Proposed Action is required under SEQRA.
- 4. This resolution shall be effective immediately.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE FORESTVILLE CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, CHAUTAUQUA AND CATTARAUGUS COUNTIES, NEW YORK (THE "DISTRICT") AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF TWO PROPOSITIONS TO BE VOTED UPON BY THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF SAID DISTRICT AT THE ANNUAL MEETING THEREOF TO BE HELD ON MAY 21, 2019

BE IT RESOLVED BY THIS BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE FORESTVILLE CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, CHAUTAUQUA AND CATTARAUGUS COUNTIES, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:



SECTION 1. At the annual meeting of the qualified voters of the Forestville Central School District, Chautauqua and Cattaraugus Counties, State of New York (the "District"), to be held on May 21, 2019 the following propositions shall be submitted to be voted upon (in addition to the proposition approving the budget for the District's 2019-2020 fiscal year):

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# **PROPOSITION NO. 2**

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education (the "Board") of the Forestville Central School District (the "District") is hereby authorized to purchase the following vehicles, including related equipment: two 20-passenger school buses, at an estimated maximum cost of \$55,000 each, and one minivan to be used to transport students and as a drivers' education vehicle, at an estimated maximum cost of \$25,000, for a total aggregated maximum cost of \$135,000, with such \$135,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, being raised by a tax upon the taxable property within said District to be levied and collected in annual installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by the Board, with such tax to be partially offset by State aid available therefor, and in anticipation of the collection of such tax, by the issuance of debt obligations of the District or installment purchase contracts having a term of not more than five years entered into by the District in accordance with New York State Law.

## **PROPOSITION NO. 3**

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education (the "Board") of the Forestville Central School District (the "District") is hereby authorized to undertake energy efficiency improvements to the District's existing Elementary School, Middle/High School and bus garage consisting of (i) improvements and upgrades to electrical, lighting, heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems, replacements and upgrades of variable speed drives, plug load controllers, freezer/cooler controls and a booster heater for the kitchen, and renovations, replacements and improvements to the exterior of all three school buildings, and other appurtenant and related improvements, all at a total estimated cost not to exceed \$715,509, with such cost being raised by a tax upon the taxable property of the District to be levied and collected in annual installments as provided in Section 416 of the Education Law, with such tax to be offset by State aid available therefore, and in anticipation of such tax, by obligations of the District as may be necessary.

SECTION 2. The District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to include within the notice of said annual meeting required to be published and posted by the District, a statement to the affect that the propositions set forth in Section 1 of this resolution will be voted upon at such annual meeting, which notice shall contain the full text of each such proposition.

This resolution shall take effect immediately.

#### NOTICE OF ANNUAL MEETING AND ELECTION OF THE FORESTVILLE CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the annual meeting and election of the Forestville Central School District, Chautauqua and Cattaraugus Counties, New York (the "District"), will be held on **Tuesday, May 21, 2019, from 1:00 p.m.** prevailing time to **8:00 p.m.** prevailing time **in the Middle/High School auditorium lobby at 4 Academy Street, Forestville, NY**, for the purpose of voting on the District's budget for the 2019-2020 fiscal year, voting on a proposition to purchase two 20-passenger school buses and 1 minivan for use in the transportation program of the District, voting on a proposition to undertake an energy performance contract, electing one at-large member of the Board of Education, and transacting such other business as is authorized by law.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that a public hearing for the voters of the District on the 2019-2020 budget will be held on **Thursday, May 9, 2019, at 5:00 p.m.** prevailing time in the Forestville High School Library, 4 Academy Street, Forestville, NY.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that the business to be conducted at such annual meeting and election shall consist of voting on the following propositions, and any other propositions authorized to be voted upon by law and the rules of the Board of Education:

#### **PROPOSITION #1**

Shall the following resolution be adopted, to-wit:

RESOLVED, that the budget for the Forestville Central School District (the "District"), for the fiscal year of the District commencing July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, as presented by the Board of Education, is hereby approved and adopted and the required funds therefor are hereby appropriated and the necessary real property taxes required shall be



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raised by a tax on the taxable property in the District to be levied and collected as required by law.

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PROPOSITION #2 – ACQUISITION OF SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION VEHICLES

Shall the following resolution be adopted, to-wit:

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education (the "Board") of the Forestville Central School District (the "District") is hereby authorized to purchase the following vehicles, including related equipment: two 20-passenger school buses, at an estimated maximum cost of \$55,000 each, and one minivan to be used to transport students and as a drivers' education vehicle, at an estimated maximum cost of \$25,000, for a total aggregated maximum cost of \$135,000, with such \$135,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, being raised by a tax upon the taxable property within said District to be levied and collected in annual installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by the Board, with such tax to be partially offset by State aid available therefor, and in anticipation of the collection of such tax, by the issuance of debt obligations of the District or installment purchase contracts having a term of not more than five years entered into by the District in accordance with New York State Law.

# PROPOSITION #3 – 2019 ENERGY PERFORMANCE CONTRACT

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education (the "Board") of the Forestville Central School District (the "District") is hereby authorized to undertake energy efficiency improvements to the District's existing Elementary School, Middle/High School and bus garage consisting of (i) improvements and upgrades to electrical, lighting, heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems, replacements and upgrades of variable speed drives, plug load controllers, freezer/cooler controls and a booster heater for the kitchen, and renovations, replacements and improvements to the exterior of all three school buildings, and other appurtenant and related improvements, all at a total estimated cost not to exceed \$715,509, with such cost being raised by a tax upon the taxable property of the District to be levied and collected in annual installments as provided in Section 416 of the Education Law, with such tax to be offset by State aid available therefore, and in anticipation of such tax, by obligations of the District as may be necessary.



TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that an optical scanning voting machine will be used to record the vote on the budget, on all propositions, and on the election of one Board member. One at-large vacancy will be filled on the Board of Education by reason of the expiration of the term of office of one incumbent. The candidate receiving the largest number of votes shall be elected to the term to commence July 1, 2019 and expiring June 30, 2023.

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TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that all candidates for the office of member of the Board of Education shall be nominated by petition. Each petition shall be directed to the Clerk of the District, shall be signed by at least twenty-five (25) qualified voters of the District, shall state the residence of each signer and shall state the name and residence of the candidate. Each petition shall be filed in the office of the Clerk of the District between the hours of **9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.** not later than the thirtieth (30th) day preceding the annual meeting and election, to-wit, **April 22, 2019**.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that applications for absentee ballots may be obtained at the office of the Clerk of the District between the hours of **8:00 a.m.** prevailing time and **4:00 p.m.** prevailing time except Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays. Completed applications must be received by the District Clerk at least seven days before the election, if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or on the day before the election, if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter. A list of all persons to whom absentee ballots shall have been issued will be available in the office of the Clerk of the District, where it shall be available for public inspection between the hours of **8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.**, prevailing time, until the day set for voting, except Saturdays, Sundays and holidays and such list shall also be posted at the polling place for such annual meeting and election. Absentee ballots must be received by the office of the Clerk of the District not later than **5:00 p.m.** on **May 21, 2019**.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that the Board of Education of the District will have prepared and completed a detailed statement in writing of the amount of money which will be required during the 2019-2020 fiscal year for school purposes, specifying the several purposes and the amount for each. Such statement shall be completed at least seven days before the budget hearing at which it is to be presented and copies thereof shall be prepared and made available, upon request, to residents within the District during the period of seven days before the budget hearing and/or fourteen days immediately preceding the annual meeting and election (exclusive of Saturday, Sunday or holidays), and may be obtained by any resident in the District at each school building in the District between the hours of **8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.** prevailing time during the District Office.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that the Board of Education of the District has adopted rules for the submission of propositions to be considered at the annual



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meeting and election, and printed copies for general distribution in the District are available at the office of the District Clerk.
