

Alternative Veterans' Exemption for School Taxes

Public Hearing
Thursday November 6, 2014

NYS Law Passed

 State law was passed in December 2013 allowing school districts to offer veterans' exemptions

Information Gathering

 During 2014, the district gathered information from counties and assessors related to the exemption

Public Hearing

 Public Hearing November, 2014 to discuss the exemptions and gather community input

Board of Education Decision

 Before March 1, 2015, the Board of Education will decide whether it is in the best interest of taxpayers to offer the exemption

Timeline



- » Share information with district taxpayers regarding veterans' exemptions
- » Communicate the potential impact of the exemptions on the Forestville CSD and it's taxpayers
- » Obtain input from taxpayers in our community
- » Provide the Board of Education with the information needed to make an informed decision



3 LEVELS OF EXEMPTION

(only available on the taxpayer's primary residence)


Served during a time of war

• 15% reduction in assessed value

Up to maximum of \$6,000*

Served in a combat zone

 Additional 10% reduction in assessed value




Incurred a serviceconnected disability

 Additional reduction in assessed value equal to 50% of service-connected disability rating

 Up to maximum of additional \$20,000*

^{*}above maximums, which are set by each taxing jurisdiction, are consistent with thresholds set by Chautauqua County





Impact on Forestville CSD

Potential Savings to Veteran Taxpayers

(estimate based on 2014 tax rate)

Potential Cost to Non-veteran Taxpayers

Estimate approximately 1% tax rate increase in addition to any budgetary levy increase.



EXAMPLE of STAR Impact: Homeowner in Hanover assessed at \$80,000 that qualifies for Senior STAR and all 3 Veteran's exemptions:
