Dear Parents,

I am very happy to hear that your child will be a part of my  $2^{nd}$  Grade class next school year.

I will be connecting you to Class Dojo soon. It will be my primary source of communication just as the 1st Grade teachers have done. I will also keep you updated daily with a Parent/Teacher/Student Daily Work Folder, as well as with frequent Newsletters.

As you might have noticed we'll be GOOFY OVER 2ND GRADE!

Here is the supply list for my  $2^{nd}$  Grade. I am requesting that each student comes to class on the first day with his/her own set of supplies so that we can minimize the possible spread of germs.

#### The list is as follows:

- 3 vinyl 3-prong pocket folders (select basic colors and I will put their names on them)
- \* 1 pair of earbuds or headphones
- 1 doodle pad (8x10 blank paper pad)
- \* 1 box of 24-count Crayola crayons (other brands do not hold up well with use)
- 1 box of 16-count (or 24) colored pencils
- \* 1 pair of Fiskar brand student-sized scissors
- 24 #2 standard (please avoid the plastic-coated ones) pencils they do not sharpen well.
- 6 large (gallon-sized) Ziploc baggies (I will put their names on them)
- 2 yellow fluorescent Hi-liters
- 2 large pink erasers
- 6-pack \*Expo dry erase markers (fine-point, to be replaced when necessary)
- 1 large sturdy pencil box for pencils/supplies
- \* 3 large Elmer's brand glue sticks
- 2 red "teacher ink pens"
- 1 pack of 3x3" Post-It Notes (any color)
- 1 oversized old -shirt for Art class/messy projects in a labeled gallon-size Ziploc baggie
- 1 package of baby wipes
- 1 Ziploc sandwich baggie with the following coins for Math Class: 10 pennies, 10 dimes,
- 10 nickels, and 4 quarters (Money will be returned at the end of the year.)
- 1 plastic 12-inch ruler with inches side and centimeters side
- $2\ {\rm rectangular}$  boxes of Kleenex
- 1 large sturdy book bag

I will write your child's name on the 3-prong vinyl folders and Ziploc bags. But, please print your child's name on most of the other items with a permanent marker. I will send a note informing you that something might need to be replaced due to use.

Your child must have sneakers on PE days. (No Crocs, flip-flops, or sport sandals allowed.) No jewelry (earrings, rings, necklaces, watches) allowed.

If your child must wear glasses during PE, please send a signed permission slip.
